ST. JAMES MUSIC / DANCE PROGRAM

With the invaluable collaboration of St. James United Church and the expertise of dance instructor Yazan Sawalha, Camp Cosmos seamlessly integrated a captivating music and dance program. Enriching the weekly schedule for our 7-8 age group, and occasionally involving other age groups, campers delved into diverse cultural dances and music. Yazan's skillful choreography and teaching provided an engaging platform for our campers' exploration and learning.

INTERCULTURAL PROGRAM

This year at Camp Cosmos, under the dedicated guidance of our intercultural coordinator, Couscous we embarked on an extraordinary journey of cultural Couscous' exploration. remarkable leadership and vision brought together a variety of experiences that enriched the lives of our young participants. Throughout the program, our campers had the opportunity to delve into the vibrant cultural landscape of Montreal, engaging in a variety of workshops that touched on vital topics such as bullying prevention, Indigenous communities, Moroccan culture, languages from around the world, and the creation of passports that celebrated their unique backgrounds. Notably, the cellphilm project sparked creativity as campers crafted videos on environmental Baguette solutions. and Rainbow's leadership nurtured a deep understanding of eco-conscious living, leaving campers inspired to make sustainable choices.
